Rabbi Gold's Parsha Corner

"Hashem, your G-d, has multiplied you and behold, you are like the stars of Heaven in abundance." (Devarim 1:10) The Midrash explains that there are three times that Klal Yisroel is compared to the stars.

- 1) Just as one star is greater than another, so, too, Klal Yisroel has different levels, one greater than another: Kohanim, Leviim; and Yisraelim.
- 2) Just as there is no end to the stars, so, too, there is no end to our People.
- 3) Just as the stars have power from one end of the world to another, so, too, Klal Yisroel manifests such power.

Chazal teach us that Hashem's bracha to Avraham Avinu, that his descendants will be likened to stars, is multifaceted. Not only will they be compared to stars in quantity, but also in attributes.

Here at Camp Shalom, all of our campers are stars and bring something unique to the bunk. We have great daveners, learners, athletes, ba'alei middos, and more. Each camper is recognized for the greatness that he/she brings to the bunk and is given the opportunity to develop these attributes in camp. Especially during the nine days, our campers learn the importance of treating each person the way they want to be treated.

PARSHA Q & A—Devarim & Tisha B'Av

1. What is another name for Parshas Devarim?

Mishneh Torah (the 'repetition' of the Torah. Moshe is giving his final speech of reviewing the mitzvos and history of Bnai Yisrael)

2. What number book of the Torah is Sefer Devarim?

3. How long were Bnai Yisrael in the Midbar?

40 years

4. Why did they receive this punishment of being in the midbar?

Because of the Chet Hameraglim (sin of the spies)- Bnai Yisrael believed the loshon hara that the meraglim reported about Eretz Yisrael. They did not have trust in Hashem would help them conquer the land.

5. When did Bnai Yisrael cry because of the lashon hara about Eretz Yisrael?

Tisha B'av. They cried in the midbar that night for no reason, so Hashem said that many years later he will give them a reason to cry, over the destruction of the Beis Hamikdash.

6. Why did Moshe want everyone to be at his speech?

This way when they enter Eretz Yisrael and Moshe was not there, no one could argue with what Moshe had commanded. They all heard it from Moshe together.

7. Why does Moshe explain his speech in 70 languages (Rashi)?

Looking towards the future in the galus, Moshe gives the message that Torah can be learned by everyone, no matter where you live or what language you speak.

8. When Moshe recalls the mistakes of Bnai Yisrael, there is not always the specific details of their sins. Why not?

Moshe does not want to embarrass or insult Bnai Yisrael.

9. What is the Shabbos before Tisha B'av called?

Shabbat Chazon

10. When is there an exception to eating meat during the 9 days?

1. Shabbos! 2. If someone is making a siyum on completing a section of Torah.

11. Why was the Beis Hamikdash destroyed?

Because of Sinas Chinam- hating someone for no reason. (ie. Causing fights, being mean, hurting someone's feelings) Review the Story of Kamtza and Bar Kamtza!

<u>Table Discussion:</u> What can YOU do to help create Ahavas Chinam and result in the building of the 3rd Beis Hamikdash?

12. What are some of the things that we dont do on Tisha B'av?

We dont eat or drink, wear leather shoes, no bathing or washing, no using oil or perfume on your body
