Torah Time: Parshat Chukat

Parshat Chukat teaches about the Parah Adumah (red cow), used to purify those who became impure. It also tells of Miriam's death, after which the water stopped flowing. In response to the people's complaints, Moshe hit a rock to bring water instead of speaking to it as Hashem instructed. Because of this, Hashem said Moshe couldn't enter Eretz Yisrael.

Rashi explains Moshe missed a powerful chance to sanctify Hashem's name by showing that even a rock obeys His word. This could have inspired Bnei Yisrael to follow Hashem wholeheartedly. The lesson: always look for opportunities to make a Kiddush Hashem through our actions or restraint, and don't let them pass by.

What is the difference between a חק and a משפט? Why is a חק so important? What is the פרה אדומה? What happens right after מרים dies? to אהרון and משה tell משה and do? What do they do instead? Which two nations attack the Jewish people at the end of the פרשה? Why does it sound like בני ישראל mourned more for אהרון than they did for משה?
